## National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

Dispose of unused or unwanted prescription pills on **Saturday, April 24, 2021**, at the Town Hall parking lot between the hours of **10:00 AM-2:00 PM**. Please, no liquids, creams, or needles.

If you miss this event, the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) has a drop box located in the lobby of Town Hall to dispose of unused or unwanted prescription pills. The drop box is accessible during regular business hours. Properly disposing of unwanted prescription pills prevents misuse and helps protect the environment.

# ROACHES

As summer brings hotter temperatures and dryer conditions, the Sanitary District would like to remind our residents about roaches.

Contrary to popular belief, roaches do not like to swim up sewer drains. The water in your drain trap can evaporate in a month, allowing roaches to climb up the dry drain. Once in a home, they head straight to a water source. Drains should be covered when not in use. Run water in unused drains at least once a month. Keeping the drain trap filled with water also prevents odors from seeping in.

In Arizona, many roaches live in the watered landscaped areas of plants and shrubbery. These areas are a great water source that roaches use to survive. Homeowners must take the initiative to treat their own property to help control the roach population.

If you notice roaches near a sewer manhole that is close to your property, you may report the problem to us by phone or through our website. The Sanitary District can treat for roaches near the manhole, but not on private property.
