## **4 WAYS TO PAY YOUR BILL**



#### 1. Auto-Pay:

Have your payment automatically deducted from your bank account and never miss a payment again. Call our office at **480-837-9444** or go to our website to download the form.

### 2. Online Bill Payment:

You can securely pay your bill online with a credit/debit card or an E-Check at <a href="https://www.az-fhsd.gov">www.az-fhsd.gov</a>. There is a \$1.00 third-party charge for this service.

### 3. Mail Payment:

To ensure your payment is correctly applied to your account, please include the top portion of your billing statement. Make check payable to **Fountain Hills Sanitary District** or **FHSD** and mail to **16941 E. Pepperwood Circle, Fountain Hills, AZ 85268**.

### 4. Pay in Person:

Deliver your payment to our Billing Department located at 16941 E. Pepperwood Circle Fountain Hills, Monday – Friday 8:00 AM -5:00 PM. After hours, deposit your payment in the drop box located out front.

## **LATE FEE:**

The Sanitary District gives residents a generous amount of time to pay their sewer user fee before a \$25.00 late fee is applied.

To maintain your good payment history and avoid the late fee, make your payment by the due date listed on the front side of this bill.

Payments not received in full by the due date may result in additional interest or lien fees.

## **Sodium Pollution**

Every year more than 700,000,000 gallons of wastewater is produced from homes and businesses in Fountain Hills. Every drop of that wastewater generated in town is recycled and beneficially reused for irrigation purposes at local parks, golf courses, and refills Fountain Lake.

Each year there are 1 million pounds of sodium added to wastewater from the salt added to water softeners. This sodium ends up on parks and golf courses, damaging their turf. Before you add your next bag of salt to your water softener, consider using a safer salt alternative.

# **National Rx Drug Take Back Day**

October 23, 2021, was National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) in Fountain Hills collected 36.8 lbs of prescription pills in that single day.

From October 1<sup>st</sup> through November 23, 2021, 147.4 lbs of pills were collected in the drop box. **Thank you**, Fountain Hills residents, for keeping prescription pills out of the sewer and protecting our environment.

Here are some reminders of how to dispose of prescription drugs:

**DO:** Place pills in a clear plastic bag and drop them off at

the MCSO drop box (in Town Hall Lobby).

**DO:** Tape needles and bottles of liquids, then

dispose of them in the trash.

**DO NOT:** Flush liquids or pills down the toilet or drain.

# Residential Sewage Ejector Pumps

If your home is built on a hillside below the street level or if it has a basement with a bathroom, chances are you have a Sewage Ejector Pump. A Sewage Ejector Pump is necessary when a portion or whole home is built below the main sewer pipe, typically buried in the street. First, a small holding tank collects waste from drains and toilets. Then, a small pump conveys both liquid and solid waste up and out to the sewer. Here's some facts most don't know about residential sewage ejector pumps:

- A private sewage ejector pump and tank is the responsibility of the homeowner, not the Sanitary District.
- Make sure to have it thoroughly checked out by a knowledgeable home inspector or plumber if purchasing a property.
- Just like an air conditioner or roof, sewage pumps have a finite life and must be replaced at some point.
- Don't flush wipes or any other material that won't break down in water. It could clog the pump and cause a sewage back-up into your home.
- Don't dispose of cooking fat, oil, or grease in your drain. It can solidify in the tank or pump, causing a back-up.
